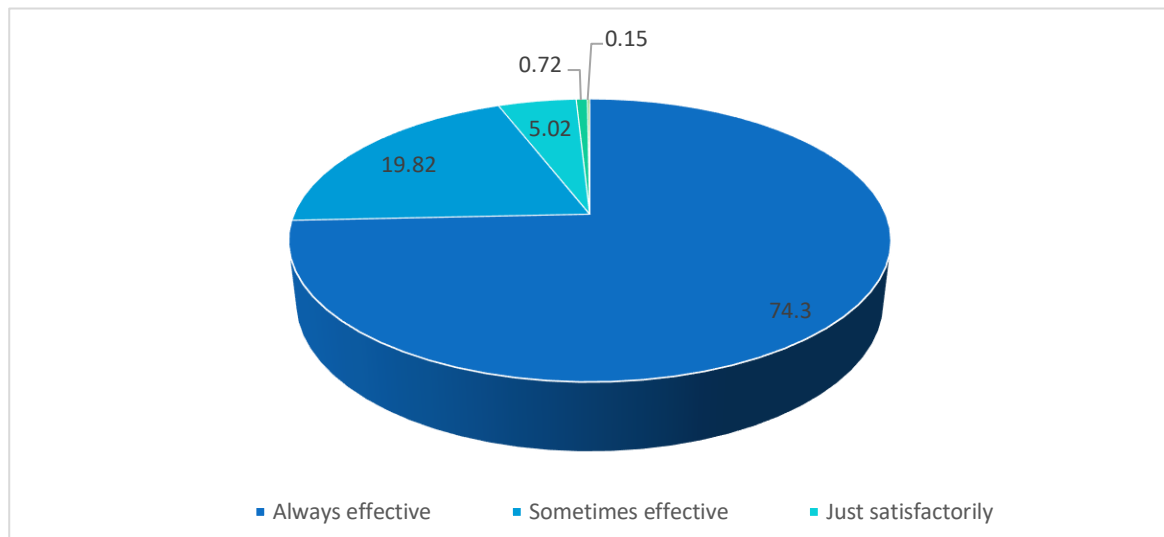

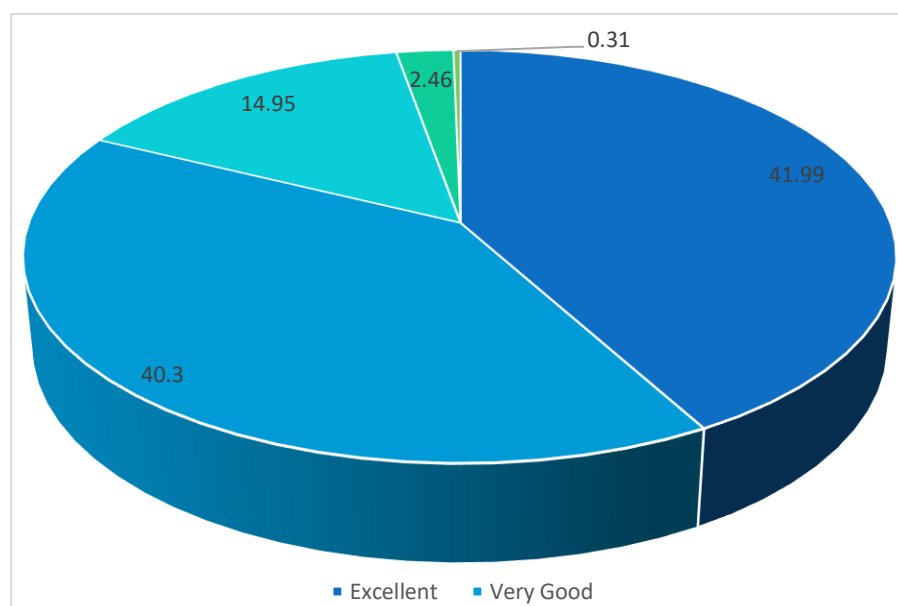

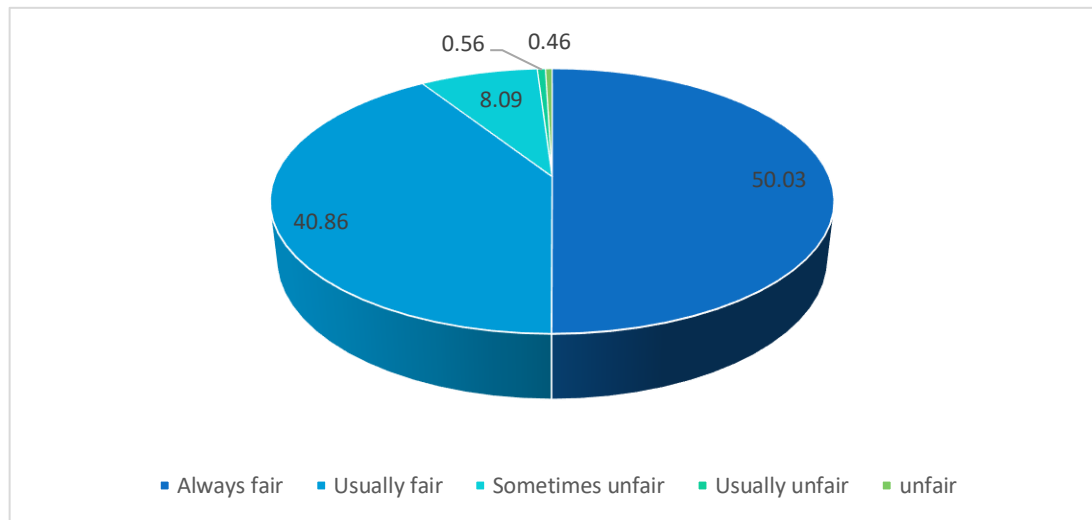
4. The teachers approach to teaching

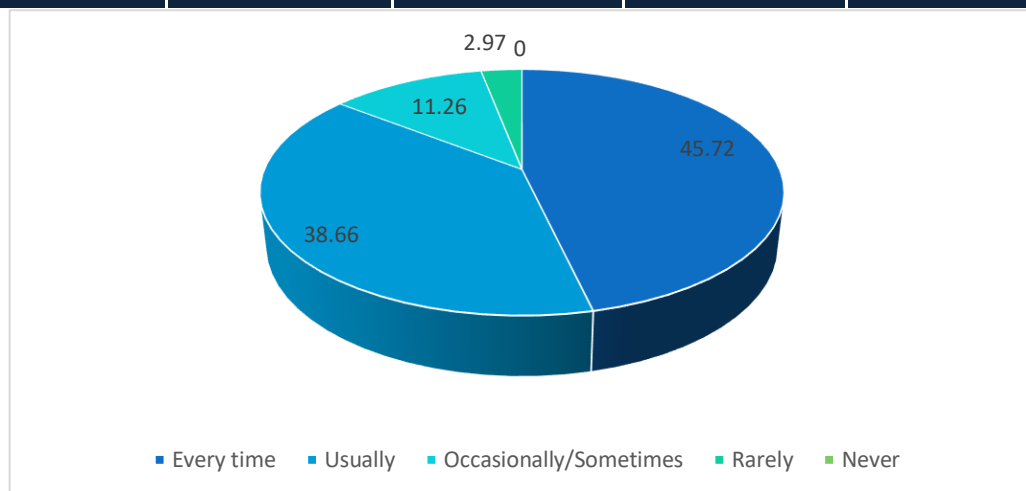

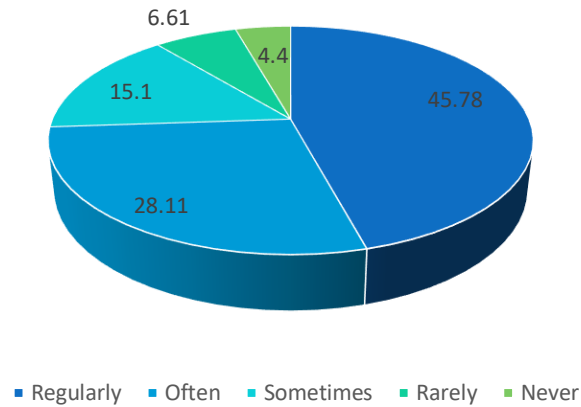

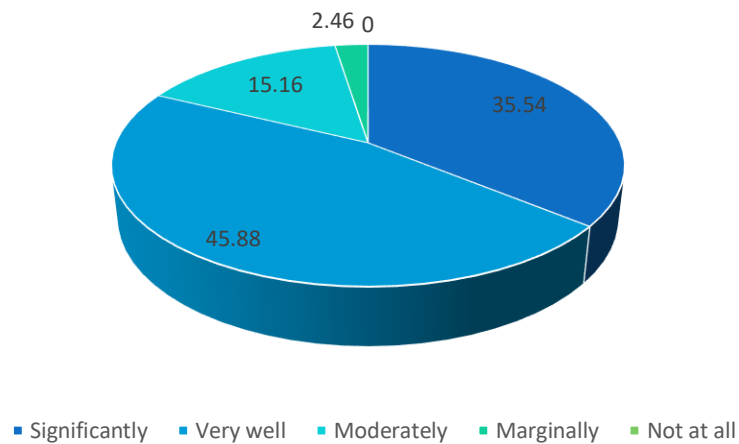

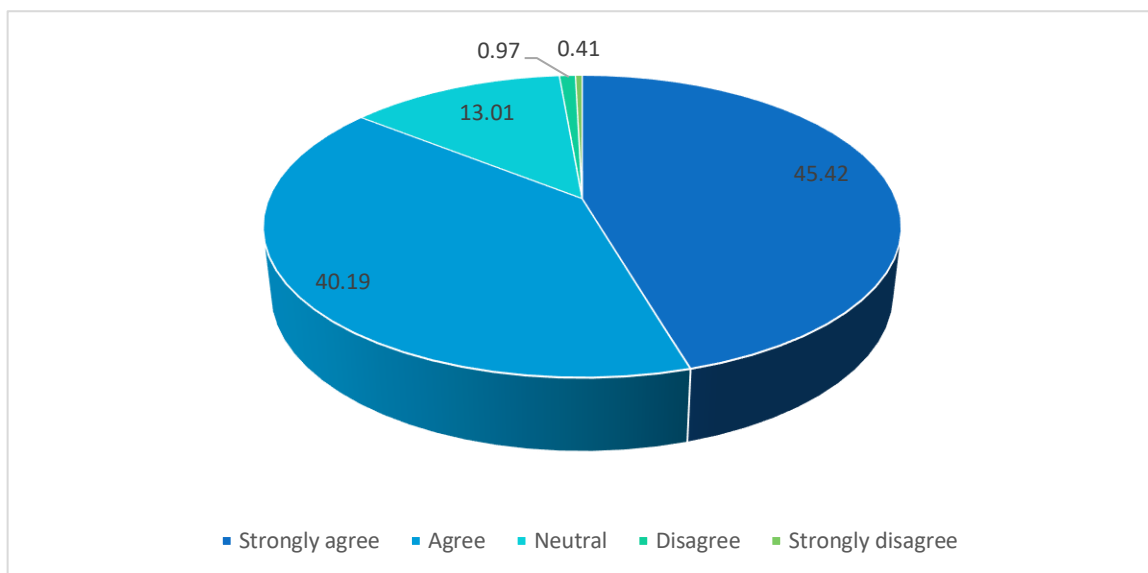

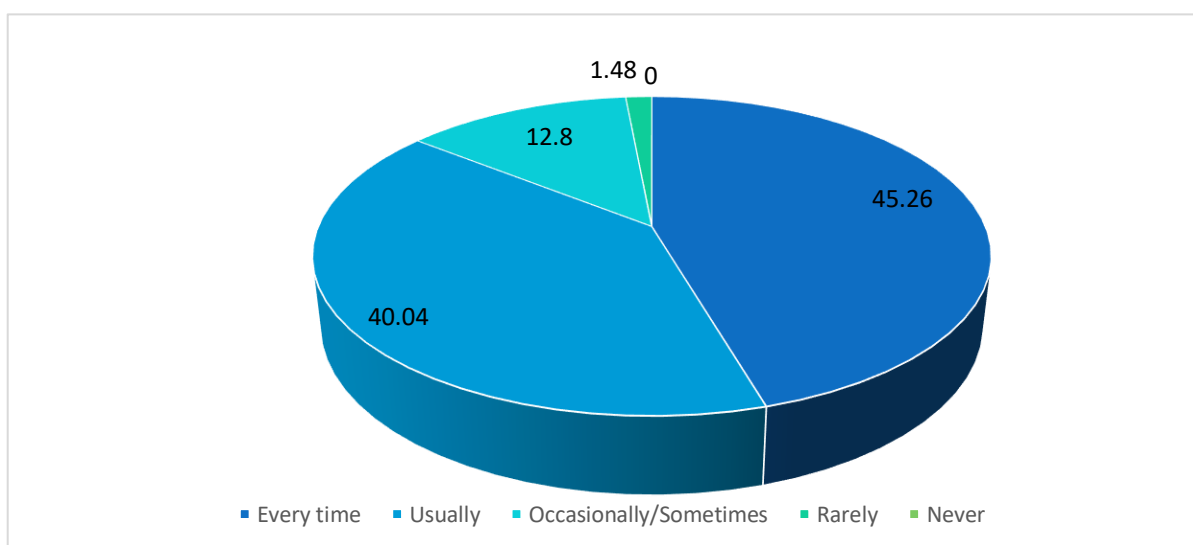

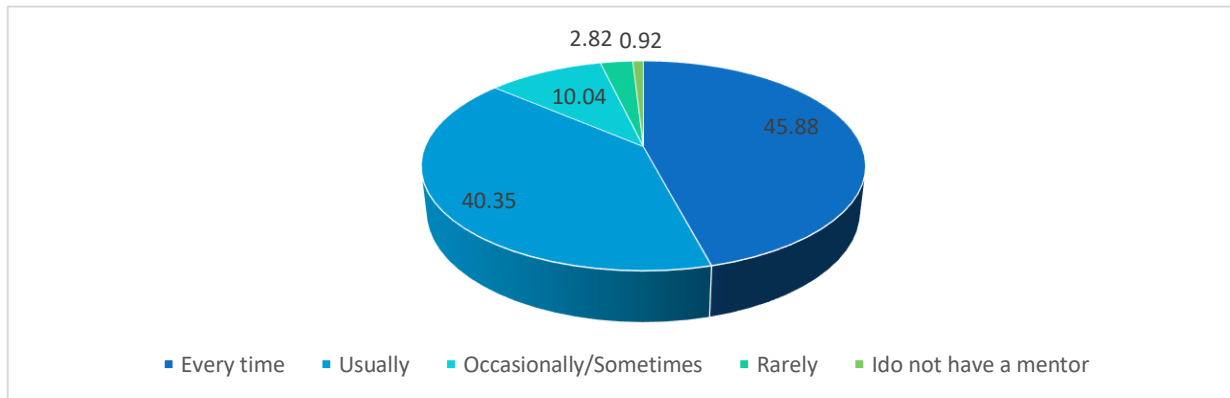
10. Teacher informs about expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes

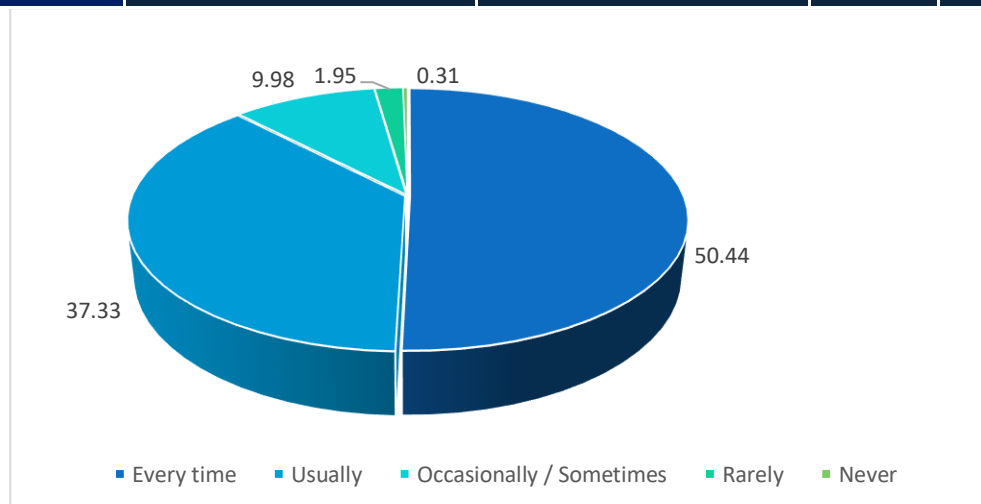

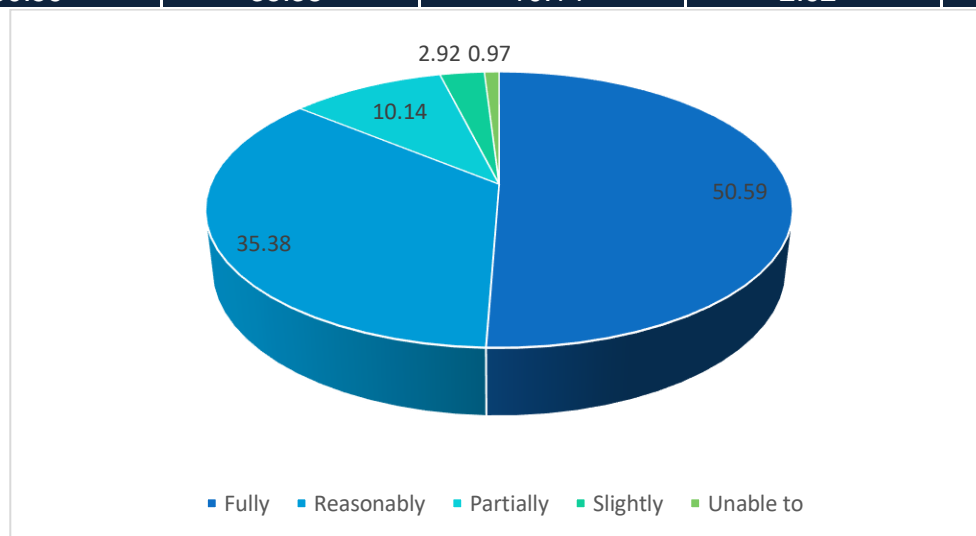
12.The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and application

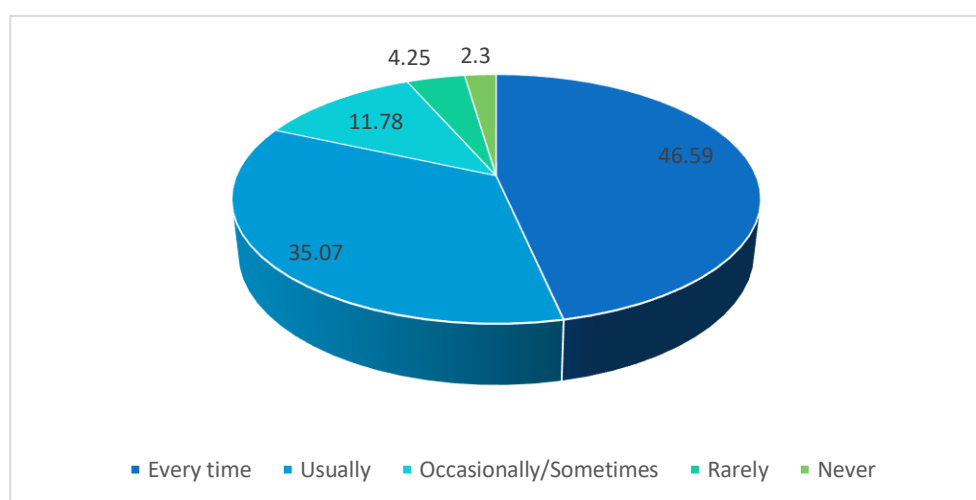

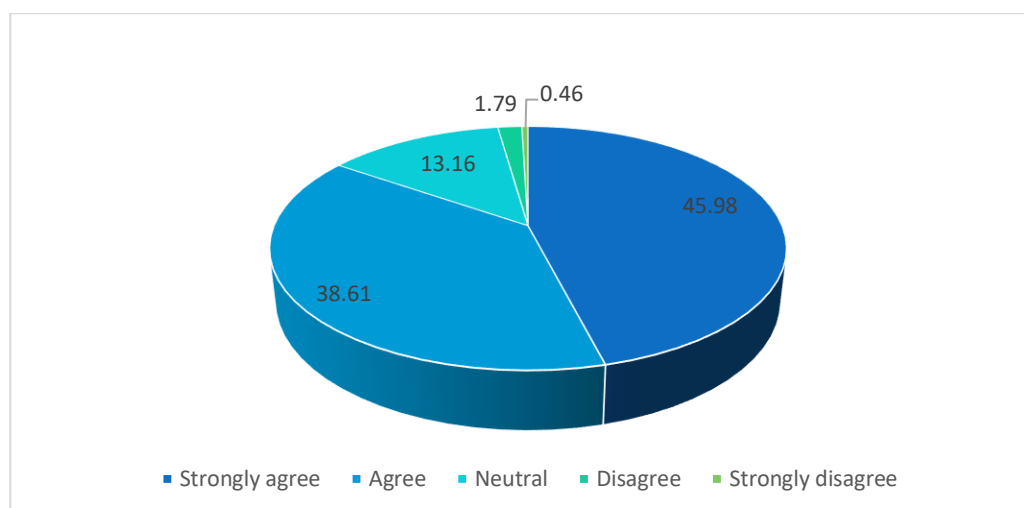

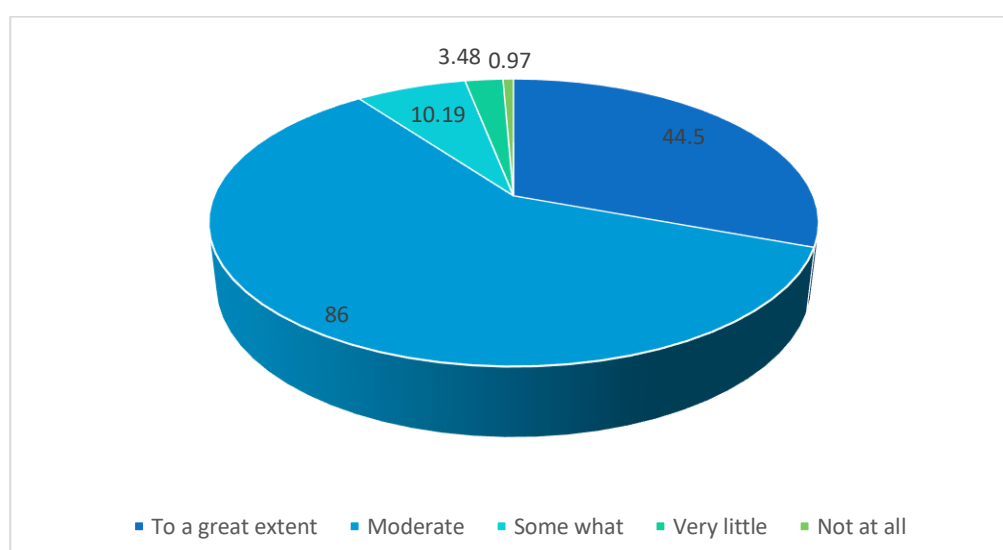
15. Monitor and review continuous quality improvement in teaching learning process

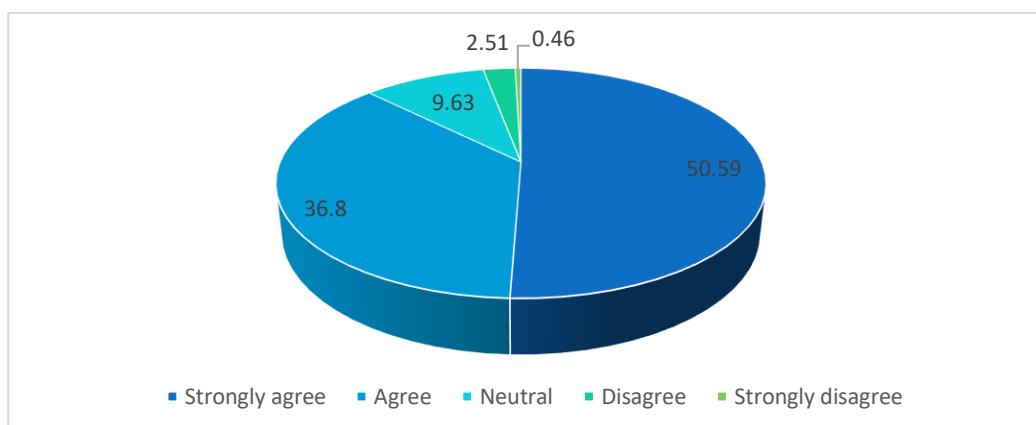
16. Student centric methods

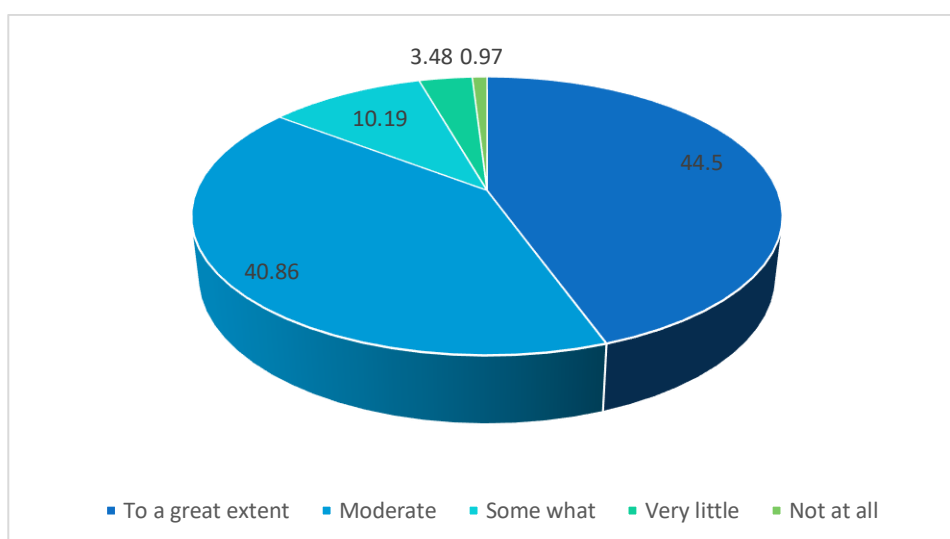
17. Teachers encourage to participate in extracurricular activities

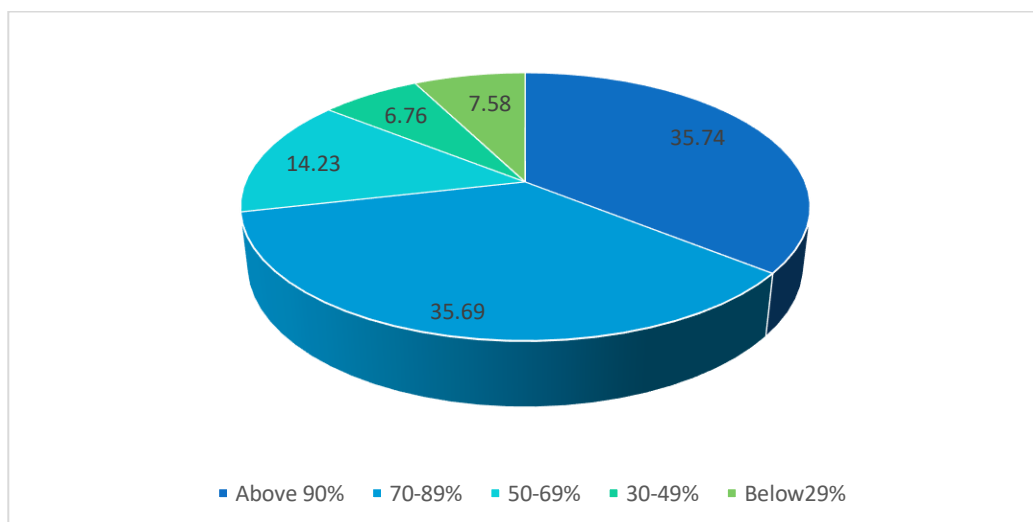
