










8. The teaching and mentoring process facilitates in cognitive, social and emotional growth


9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow




10. Teacher informs about expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes




11. Mentor follow-up system




12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications



13. The teachers identify the strengths and encourage with providing right level of challenges




14. Teachers identify the weakness and helps to overcome




15. Monitor and review continuous quality improvement in Teaching learning process


16. Student centric methods

17. Teachers encourage to participate in extracurricular activities


