### Preface:

### Highlights of the college:

- One of the top Arts & Science colleges is Dhanraj Baid Jain College, which was founded in 1972 by the Tamil Nadu Educational & Medical Foundation. Extending over 50 years of enhancing education based on values and resolutely working to elevate human excellence.
- Three postgraduate courses and nine undergraduate courses are offered by the college.
   The College's NCC, YRC, RRC, and NSS wings are quite active and involve students in providing service to the community.

- ➤ Increase efforts to enhance the qualifications of faculty members through opportunities for obtaining advanced degrees and certifications, such as Ph.D., NET, and SET.

### Action taken

The department has implemented appropriate measures to ensure that all departmental activities are documented under NAAC guidelines.

- > Greater emphasis should be placed on thorough and accurate documentation of all departmental activities and programs in line with NAAC guidelines.
- > Increased efforts should be made to establish more collaborations for faculty and student exchanges, internships, and similar opportunities. Additionally, more faculty members should participate in Faculty Development Programs (FDPs).
