The Chairman welcomed the members and briefed them on departmental activities. The agenda was then taken up for discussion. After deliberation, the following resolutions were unanimously passed.

Agenda

To consider and approve the syllabus for M. Com (General) from the academic year 2026–2027 onwards.

Resolutions

- The revised M.Com (General) syllabus was approved.
- The curriculum incorporates the TANSICHE-recommended framework.
- Students may choose one elective subject offered in the respective semester.
- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) as prescribed by TANSICHE have been included.
- The valuation of Operations Research (Semester I) will be undertaken by the Commerce Department staff.

- To Adopt the M.Com General Syllabus of University of Madras as such.

Regulations

(As per the integrated common regulations of the University of Madras)

1. Admission

Candidates with B.Com or related degrees (B.B.A., B.B.M., or equivalent with Commerce/Accounts as allied subjects) from recognized universities are eligible. The duration of the course is two academic years.

2. Eligibility for Degree

A candidate must complete four semesters, earn 91 credits, and fulfil all prescribed requirements.

3. Progression

Students must satisfy attendance requirements as prescribed to proceed to subsequent semesters.

4. Passing Minimum

A minimum of 50% is required in each paper. Completion of 91 credits is mandatory to pass the programme.

5. Classification

- **First Class** – 60% and above (Aggregate)
- **First Class with Distinction** – 75% and above at first appearance
- **Second Class** – All other successful candidates

6. Ranking

Ranking/Distinction is awarded only to candidates who pass all examinations at first appearance.

Course Structure – M. Com (General)

Total Credits: 91

Semester I – 20 Credits

Core Courses and Electives (Business Finance, Digital Marketing, Banking & Insurance, and two electives)

Semester II – 24 Credits

Core Courses (Strategic Cost Management, Corporate Accounting, etc.), Electives, SEC, and Internship(Credits)

Semester III – 26 Credits

Core Courses (Tax Planning, Research Methodology, Advanced Cost Accounting, Computer Applications), Electives, SEC, and Internship(Credits).

Semester IV – 21 Credits

Core Courses (Corporate & Economic Law, Human Resource Analytics), Project with Viva, Elective, SEC, and Extension Activity.

Internship

The internship is carried out during respective Semesters. The report shall be submitted within one month of completion. The evaluation will be conducted internally, and the marks awarded will be reflected in the respective Semester Statement of Marks.

Project Work (Semester IV)

- Project Report: Minimum 80 pages
- Evaluation: 100 Marks (Internal – 25; Project Report – 50; Viva-Voce – 25)
- Supervision by a faculty guide
- External and internal evaluation
- Five periodical reviews (5 marks each – total 25 internal marks)

The meeting concluded with the Chairman expressing sincere appreciation to all members for their valuable suggestions and active participation. The resolutions passed will be implemented from the academic year 2026–2027. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
